These seasoned professional musicians will perform with student musicians from the Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District's nationally recognized orchestras, choirs and horn sections on many of their hits.

Taking place on March 11 at Santa Monica High School's Barnum Hall, the concert will raise funds for the Santa Monica-Malibu Education Foundation. Proceeds will support arts programs at all SMMUSD schools next year.

This year, the concert has been renamed the Greg Coote Concert For The Arts, in memory of entertainment executive and SMMUSD parent Greg Coote. Coote led the Ed Foundation's For The Arts endowment campaign to ensure the continuity of arts programming for students in the Santa Monica-Malibu public schools. He sadly passed away in 2014.

"Greg's passion for the arts led him to spearhead the creation of our \$2.9 million For The Arts endowment, which funds grants for visual arts supplies, music coaches, drama programs and additional arts across the district.
